This collection of map projections was made and ordered without taking into consideration any specific cartographic principle: our aim is only to provide some blank graticules that can be used by children to represent their ideas on a map. All the graticules are visible for every 10 degrees latitude and longitude. The examples do not include intentionally the contour lines of the continents: we do not want to give children a previously created template map, because one of the main aims of the competition is "to promote the creative representation of the world", and a template could notably limit their personal creative work. The use of these examples is not compulsory for teachers and children: they can feel themselves free to use other projections or to create their own solutions.

Using Harry W. Costner's words in his material entitled "A teacher's introduction to the Barbara Petchenik International World Map Design Competition": This item "projection" is employed here in its widest sense, from copying or tracing by hand to manipulating by computer the many formal map projections that cartographers have found useful. It is not the intent of the Competition, however, to promote the study of map projections per se, but to give children the opportunity of exploring the many ways that we can think about and represent the world we share.

CHILDREN MAP THE WORLD: SELECTIONS FROM THE BARBARA PETCHENIK CHILDREN’S WORLD MAP COMPETITION, VOLUME 2 / Ed. Temenoujka Bandrova, Jesus Reyes Nunez, Milan Konecny, and Jeet Atwal. Redlands, CA: ESRI Press, 2009. Pp. 144; illus. (col.). ISBN-13 9781589482463 (paper), US\$29.95.

Here’s a book – offered up as a wonderful gift (clap your hands in grateful astonishment!) – that’s an insult to so many people on so many different levels it’s hard to keep them straight. First and foremost, it’s an insult to the children of the world, presented here as unimaginative consumers of graphic clichés and political slogans. This makes it equally insulting to anyone who lays down \$29.95 for the book (though I’ll bet ESRI plans on giving most of the copies away). It’s an insult to the “educators, cartographers, and amateur map enthusiasts” who are promised “a

about maps, and the goal here, you know, is to let kids know how great maps are, how important, how vital.

Just in case there are any out there who might not already have gotten the message, the competition is sponsored by the ICA Commission on Cartography and Children, whose goals include “promoting the use and enjoyment of maps by children,” which is to say that the competition is a promotional campaign. For maps. Oh, and for the ICA, “the world authoritative body for cartography.” If you Google “children’s poster competition,” you get 4.5 million hits. At the top of the first page today is the competition sponsored by Dialogue on Diarrhea. The winning poster shows a nursing calf and a nursing baby, with the text “Baby cow should feed on cows milk / Human baby should feed on human milk.” Next on Google’s list is a competition sponsored by the UN’s Agenda 21 on sustainable development. The third is for *World without Polio: Children’s*

A Response to Denis Wood's Review of *Children Map the World* (*Cartographica* 46(4): 267–68)

Children Map the World, published by ESRI Press in 2009, is the second in a series of books that present selected entries to the Barbara Petchenik International World Map Design Competition. This second volume contains drawings submitted between 2005 and 2009. For those readers not familiar with this competition, it was first organized by the International Cartographic Association (ICA) in 1993 and has been held every two years ever since; it was instituted “to promote the creative representation of the world in graphic form by children” (ICA Commission on Cartography and Children 2011b, para. 1).

graphy and Children is responsible for proposing a colleague to chair the jury (in the most recent competitions, a commission member); the nomination is approved or declined by the ICA Executive Committee (EC). Once a jury chair has been approved by the EC, both chairs can make proposals for the other seven members of the jury. The chair of the jury is also responsible for organizing the first stage of the judging process, which takes place by e-mail. Each member of the jury sends his or her vote separately to the chair, who then counts the votes and determines the preliminary results. The first in-person

Dear Colleagues,

On behalf of the Geographical Society of Germany (Deutsche Gesellschaft für Geographie – DGfG) and the Institute for Geography of the University of Cologne, it is our pleasure to invite your country to send a team to the 9th International (iGeo). This will be held in Cologne, Germany, from 21 August to 26 August 2012, under the auspices of the International Geographical Union Olympiad Task Force. Institute for Geography in the heart of the city of Cologne beside the Rhine.

As always the iGeo competition contains three elements: a written multimedia test and a fieldwork test. The official language of the iGeo will be presented in English and students must answer in English. It is provided for non-native English speakers. A country's team will be secondary school students between 16 and 19 years of age (inclusive). Students must be selected through a national geography competition application by **21 January 2012** at the latest. 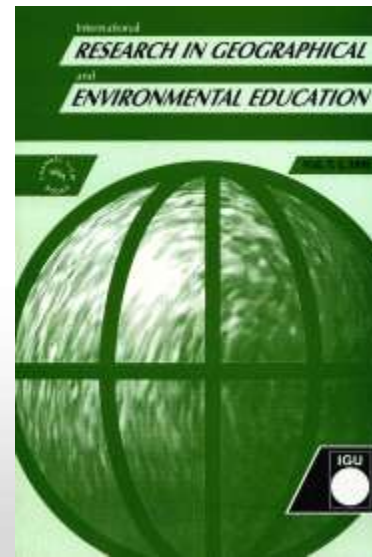
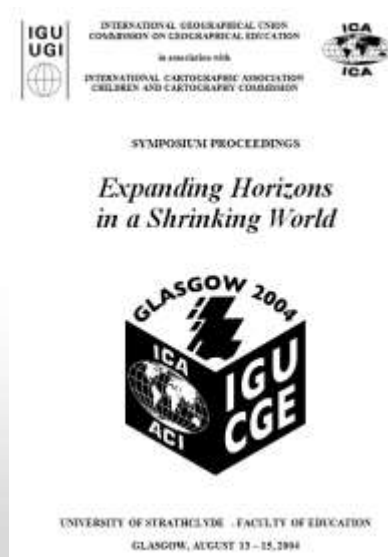
