

- Voting process about possible changes: *March-April 2016*
- Results of voting process, sending proposal of changes to ICA Executive : *May-July 2016*
- Opening the Barbara Petchenik Competition 2017 with changed rules: September 2016



Some examples on opinions:

- Only A3 size
- Evaluation of an individual drawing is not comparable to one made by several people
- Official feedback from teachers
- Opening up the participation for judging to everybody
- Considering alternative assessment methods for students with disabilities
- Split the international rules document into separate documents for entrants, national coordinators, etc.
