## The Global Goals

## 4: Education

Target: By 2030, ensure that all girls and boys complete free, equitable and quality primary and secondary education leading to relevant and Goal-4 effective learning outcomes. And eliminate gender disparities in education and ensure equal access to all levels of education and vocational training for the vulnerable, including persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples and children in vulnerable situations

Indicators: teachers in primary education, school life expectancy, out-of children of primary school age and out-of-school adolescents of lower secondary school age



Every person - child, young or adult - should be able to benefit from educational opportunities designed to meet his/her basic learning needs.

These needs comprise both essential learning tools [such as literacy, oral expression, numeracy, and problem solving] and basic learning contents (knowledge, skills, values, and attitudes), indispensable to human beings to survive, allowing them to fully develop their capacities, living and working with dignity, improving life quality, making well-founded decisions, and continuing to learn.



Cartography can play an important role in the goals proposed by the United Nations. Learning how to guide one's self into the geographic space, read maps and know how to use them as a spatial representation with a specific language is essential for the formation of autonomous citizens.

## Children who draw maps nowadays will be more conscious adults about the geographic space!

#### ICA Publications and Publication Policy — first Publication Volume is online

*In 2017 the EC introduced a new publication policy, which focuses on the conference proceedings. In order to give them an adequate visibility and reputation, a conference publication series has been established, which is administrated and hosted by a professional publisher. There are three publication options, depending on the review and the extent of the papers: ICA Advances, ICA Proceedings and ICA Abstracts.*

The benefits will be manifold:

- **Visibility:** one single point of contact for the publications of ICA events
- **Reliability:** the publications will be available at the time of the conference
- **Open Access:** the publications are published online and under the Creative Commons licence
- **Reputation:** the publisher will suggest the ICA Advances and Proceedings for inclusion in several data bases and indices (e.g. Scopus, Web of Science)
- **Standardization:** one standardized format of the publications

This new policy will not interfere with publications in ICA related journals; in contrast, it will provide an excellent basis for developing high-level journal publications.

#### New ICA conference and events publications

Starting in 2017, the ICA records the outcomes of their Conferences like ICC, RCC as well as all other ICA events in three official publication outlets, which are hosted by a commercial publisher, Copernicus GmbH:

1. [Advances in Cartography and GIScience of the International Cartographic Association](#) (short: **Advances of the ICA**) (single-blind peer review based on a full paper) – termed **Advances** in the following;
2. [Proceedings of the International Cartographic Association](#) (short: **Proceedings of the ICA**) (single-blind peer review based on submitted abstracts, developed to full paper) – termed **Proceedings** in the following;
3. [Abstracts of the International Cartographic Association](#) (short: **Abstracts of the ICA**) (single-blind peer review based on submitted abstracts; publication of abstract only) – termed **Abstracts** in the following.

With these three series, the ICA can offer excellent opportunities for their authors to present their work – full papers for more research-oriented work, abstract based full papers for advanced work-in-progress, as well as abstracts for practically oriented work or artwork, which typically are not adequately represented in a full paper.

For the ICC and for the RCC, **Advances** and **Proceedings** are published; for other ICA events, either **Advances** or **Proceedings** are published. Exceptions from this general rule require prior approval by EC. All event formats have the option to also publish the **Abstracts**.

These publications are generated from all ICA events. Organisers will be required to provide Copernicus with camera-ready manuscripts in pdf format, together with the respective metadata, four to six weeks prior to the scheduled meeting, depending on the size of the event. For each published paper a moderate APC (article processing charge) has to be paid (as of January 1st it is €17,50). This sum should be included in the event fees.

The Proceedings of the ICA are open-access publications; they are published under the Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 License and the authors retain the copyright.

The series has a long tradition going back to the first Cartographic Conference in Frankfurt am Main, Germany, in 1962. Proceedings of International Cartographic Conferences (ICC) were compiled by the local organizing committees for ICA. The series was newly established in 2017. Thus, the Proceedings of the International Cartographic Association are a continuation of the Proceedings of International Cartographic Conferences (ICC). They are available online, starting with ICC 1993.

Copernicus Publications makes sure that the online, open-access publications are indexed and archived worldwide in electronic archives, search engines, and databases, in order to guarantee their maximum dissemination and impact. Proceedings of the ICA is archived and indexed in


