24th NEWSLETTER (OCTOBER 2014)

1. Commission meetings in 2014

Our commission organized two meetings this year:

- The **first Commission meeting** was held in the Bulgarian Riviera during the 5th Jubilee Conference on Cartography and GIS on 16 June.

In the first part of the meeting, Jesús Reyes resumed the main activities developed after the last meeting during the ICC2013 conference in Dresden last year. During his presentation were addressed topics as publications, international contacts, organization of the Barbara Petchenik Competition and plans for future meetings and events. Commission Chair proposed to begin and exchange of opinions, proposals, etc on how to improve the cartographic quality of entries sent to the Barbara Petchenik Competition, first of all within the last age group (13–15 years). Our first idea is to develop it by e-mails, on our Facebook profile or on a blog during the first half of the next year, having the opportunity to resume and discuss the proposals in our next meeting in Rio de Janeiro on August 2015.

In the second part of the meeting our colleague Shimshon Livni (Kaye College of Education, Israel) had a short, but very interactive presentation on his new e-textbook entitled "On the way from the Globe to the Maps of our land".

All the conference participants had the opportunity to visit the Exhibition of a selection of Bulgarian drawings submitted for the previous Barbara Petchenik Competitions. This initiative let us appreciate the high quality of those national entries that could not represent the country in the international competitions.

- The **second Commission meeting** was in Budapest (Hungary) on the morning of 3 September, a day before the opening of the 9th ICA Workshop on Digital Approaches to Cartographic Heritage (4–5 September 2014).

This meeting was very different from the previous one in Bulgaria. Two commissions (Cartography and Children, Planetary Cartography) and a working group (International Map Year) participated together and gave a more general background of their activities during the last 12 months.

The programme began with the presentation made by the Chair-person of the Working Group on the International Map Year /IMY/, Bengt Rystedt (Sweden), to explain the activities developed for the organization of IMY 2015, followed by a presentation on the construction of its homepage, which can be visited at http://internationalmapyear.org.

It was followed by the presentations of the Commission on Planetary Cartography. Henrik Hargitai (Hungary) reported on the activities developed by the commission in the period after ICC 2013. Following, it was introduced the "Planetary map series for children", a nascent collection of beautiful maps designed especially for children, which is planned to be printed in poster format. By now, two maps are finished (Mars and the Moon) and were presented by the author and graphic designers for the participants in the joint meeting.

Finally, Jesus Reyes (Hungary) talked about the activities developed and planned by the Commission on Cartography and Children. In this occasion it was announced that the Barbara Petchenik Competition 2015 will be dedicated to the International Map Year.

2. Barbara Petchenik Competition 2015

Beginning October was officially open the Barbara Petchenik Competition 2015. ICA Secretary General, László Zentai sent a letter to all the National Committees, inviting them to organize the competition in their countries and including all the documents related to the organization of this edition of the Barbara Petchenik Award. Commission Chair sent the same documents for all the colleagues and interested people included in the mailing list of the commission, reiterating the invitation to participate and asking their help in the organization of the competition in their respective countries. The call for the competition was also shared in the Facebook profile of the commission (https://www.facebook.com/icaccc) and it was read by more than 230 people in the first two days.



4. Book performance report from Springer



In June 2014 Commission Chair received a message from the Springer Publishing House with news about our last book (Maps for the Future: Children, Education and Internet), which was published in January 2012. The message included a report with an overview of how the electronic version of our book has been performing on the market. According to the statistics given by them, our eBook had 627 chapter downloads in the year of its publication (2012) and the number of chapter downloads increased to 3738 in 2013. This means a total of 4365 chapter downloads on the SpringerLink website, placing the book to one of the top 50% most downloaded eBooks in the relevant Springer eBook Collection.




6. News and images
