Promote the use of web-based cartographic solutions for visualization of geodata in School Cartography and Geography, including the use of GIS and GIS-based solutions in schools.

# Booklet on the Children Map the World Series

The first book, published by ESRI in 2005, was very well publicised at the User Conference in San Diego in July in the same year. In his opening speech, Jack Dangermond spoke about the book against a backdrop of children's maps projected on large screens. In the "Map Gallery" located on the top floor of the Convention Centre they had a spectacular display of the maps from the book. The main title of the display was "Maps of our Children's World" with sub-groupings of the maps under topics such as Cartographic


Representations, Our Changing World, and Children's Awareness of Their Environment etc.

At the "Meet the author" book signing event, Jeet Atwal from Carleton University represented the editors of the book.

#### Second volume of the series:

"We have been involved with the ICA for many years and are pleased to continue our support of its efforts in promoting the Barbara Petchenik Children's World Map Competition," said ESRI president Jack Dangermond. The creative ability expressed by the young contributors to this book is truly amazing. I was particularly struck by the recurring theme of universal cooperation in their mapmaking efforts and sincerely hope that their view portends our future."

This book followed the popular first volume of Children Map the World, which ESRI Press published in 2005.






After an almost 6 years break, ESRI Press published the 3rd volume of the series, including 70 maps submitted to the 2013 International Cartographic Association map competition. These hand-drawn, sewn, or assembled maps conveyed powerful messages of optimism, anxiety, tolerance, and hope that reflected the competition's theme: "My Place in Today's World."

This Anniversary Edition (celebrating the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the first competition) also showcased maps from past competitions held from 1993 through 2011

Special Edition Commemorating the International Map Year (2017)


From Esri Press: "Children Map the World: Commemorating the International Map Year" celebrated the cartographic works of children worldwide. The first part includes entries to the biennial Barbara Petchenik Children's World Map Competition in 2015, which characterize the perceptions and solutions used by children as they consider "My place in today's world". The second part was a selection of drawings submitted to previous competitions, which were organized as an atlas created by children.

This book followed the popular first three volumes of Children Map the World that were published in 2005, 2009 and 2015.



Other books published by ICA that are related to the Barbara Petchenik Competition:

- "The World as Seen by Children" (2015). Published by the Chinese Sinomaps Press including a selection of 100 maps from the competitions organized in 2009 and 2011



Other books published by ICA that are related to the Barbara Petchenik Competition:

- "The World drawn by children" (2021). Published by the National Geographic Institute of Spain with a selection of 100 maps from the competitions organized in 2017 and 2019. Its' particular characteristic is that it was the first bilingual (English and Spanish) book on this topic.



Other books published by ICA member countries that are related to the Barbara Petchenik Competition:

- "SDGs in action – Sichtweisen von Generationen - A generations' view": A book hosting SDG stories of different generations using different cartographic forms of expression in the context of the UN sustainability goals (UN-SDGs). It was produced by the ICA Commission on Map Production and Geoinformation Management, JOBSTMedia Präsentation Verlag, Vienna (Austria) in 2021.

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



- Monika Kopecká from Slovakia accepted the role of the international coordinator










Selection of a Theme for the Barbara Petchenik Competitions 2025 & 2027

- Second step: organization of an online voting process for selecting a new theme







Children Map the World Series

- Proposals submitted to Esri Press (July 2023):
- Following the series under other (maybe smaller) format. Example: pocketbook printed by the Argentine colleagues in 2019, celebrating the 20th Anniversary of the competition in the country
- Making of thematic volumes, illustrating a specific topic, e.g. the "SDGs in action" book made by the ICA Commission on Map Production and Geoinformation Management (Markust Jobst, Vienna) in 2021.
- The National Geographic Institute of Spain produced the first bilingual book (The World drawn by children) in 2021, texts were written in English and Spanish. Multilingual books could be an idea to consider in the future.
- Maps submitted to the competitions could be also used to illustrate and complete other books produced by EsriPress (not only) for children.





General rules

- Possible change in the General rules (Silvia):
  - "...The entry should be an original piece of work and it can be made using traditional methods (colour pencils, water colour, etc) or a computer program."
  - Proposal: Text "or a computer program" to be removed. Considerations: increasing use of Al but unfortunately often beyond the limits of what is permissible.
- For discussion: Comments from different countries that some of the maps had not been drawn by children. Of course, no one can be sure of this, but perhaps we should think about how to indicate that the drawings should be the work of the named authors.
