

## 5. POLICIES FOR STANDARDIZATION AND ATTITUDES

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**Owner-controlled policy:**

person/institution in charge of a geographical object decides on the spelling of its name

**Conservationist policy:**

the name version as it has come down to us should be preserved (even if that causes discrepancies between spelling and pronunciation)
