

6. INTERNATIONAL STANDARDIZATION POLICIES

Starting from the local names policy:

- 1)** the source country decides on a conversion system from one script to another, or
- 2)** the receiver country decides, or
- 3)** both source country and receiver countries try to work out one joint standard for each writing system

the source country might not have the means to produce a standard

there are more than 160 receiver countries and we do not want 160 versions of each geographical name

cooperation of source country and receiver countries might work out best
