**Generic classification**

One has to know what topographic features need names on the map!

- Define feature categories suitable to the landscape
  - streams vs. canals
  - swamps vs. marshes
- Avoid feature distinctions based on size (because it will be difficult in the field to assess the relative size):
  - creeks vs. rivers
  - hills vs. mountains
