He earned his doctoral degree in 2010, and conducted his research at the Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta, USA, among others.

He was a member of Cracow's city council between 2010 and 2011. In this role he took part in the sessions of the Family and Social Policy Committee, Health and Prophylaxis Committee and the Property and Entrepreneurship Committee.

Between 2015 and 2023 he was the leader of Polish People's Party parliamentary club, and became a member of the National Security Council in 2016.

Between 2012 and 2021 he was the Chairman of the Popular Sports Teams Association's Main Council.

He is the grandson of Władysław, a soldier of the 13th Wilno Uhlan Regiment and the Peasant Battalions, and the son of Andrzej Kosiniak-Kamysz, Health Minister in the cabinet of Tadeusz Mazowiecki.

He married Paulina, with whom he has two daughters and a son.

2. VENUE

SPRINT

The sprint arena is located on the grounds of the Military University of Technology, one of the best technical universities in Poland. The sprint will be held in a nearby forest, cut by a dense network of paths and roads.

Distance from EC (by car) - 45 km, 30 min GOOGLE WAT








MIDDLE

Arena for middle distance is located in Falenica - a suburban district of Warsaw whose inhabitants can say of themselves that they "live in the forest". Dunes, a pine forest, very many paths - this is the setting of the EA, which is located in a local school.

2. VENUE

LONG / MASS START

Arena for mass start and long distance is located on a former sports airfield in Góraszka, just outside the administrative boundaries of Warsaw. There used to be an airport here, now - the "Góraszka Project" envisages the construction of a shopping centre here, but also cinemas, an amusement park, restaurants, a gym and everything to provide attractive leisure and family entertainment. For the duration of WMTBOC, however, bicycles, maps and compasses will rule here:)

And finally, the venue for the relays. The arena of the competition is the equestrian centre in Stara Miłosna. The Hippodrome currently serves the soldiers of the representative unit of the Polish Army; you can meet both soldiers and mounts of the Representative Cavalry Squadron of the Polish Army there!

3. TRAVEL AND TOURIST INFORMATION

3.1. Transport from airport to Event Centre

Event Centre is readily accessible by major roads and public transport.

3.2. Directions for obtaining entry permits (visas)

Passports and maybe a visa are needed to enter Poland for some countries. Poland is a full Schengen member state. Application for the visa should be submitted at the nearest Polish Embassy.

4. TRANSPORT


All the competitions are within 10 km from the Event Centre and can be reached by bike (except for the sprint, which is about 30-40 km by car from the EC). The organisers do not offer any transport from the EC to the competitions.







5. EMBARGOED AREAS



The areas marked in red on the map are fully embargoed, which means that these areas may not be entered at all (unless specifically permitted by the organisers). The embargoed areas are out of bounds for all potential participants and team members, including competitors, team leaders, coaches, doctors, escorts, and any other person who through their knowledge of the terrain may influence the result of the competitions.

So, no participants and no one with a potential connection to a team (athletes or others) may visit the embargoed areas, not even without a map.

The area marked in yellow is open for everyday use (e.g. living, school, etc.) - but the use of orienteering maps there is prohibited.

Roads marked in green passing through the embargoed area are open for everyday travel (commuting).

[•] For the JWMTBOC, team officials must allocate their athletes to starting groups by the competition entry deadline.

This is the deadline to confirm each team member's entry for this competition. All team officials are asked to submit the names of the competitors who will start in each class and the cycling order in relays. This can be done hand in the provided paper forms to the event office at the finish arena or at the event centre.

In individual competitions, between the competition entry deadline and two hours before the first start in the class, a competitor may be replaced for a valid reason (e.g. accident or illness). In the Relay, changes of names of the relay team members and/or their cycling order must reach the organiser at least two hours before the start of the relay class.



7. CLASSES AND PARTICIPATION

WMTBOC

- There is one class for women (called Women) and one for men (called Men). There are no age restrictions.
- All competitors must be citizens of the country of the federation they are representing.
- Competitors participate at their own risk. Third party insurance and personal injury insurance is compulsory and is the responsibility of the competitors' federation or themselves.
- All competitors represent a federation. Each federation may enter a team of an unlimited number of competitors and team officials.
- In each individual competition, every federation may enter up to 6 women and 6 men plus
 the current World Champions for the distance. Additionally, each federation may enter up
 to a further 2 women and 2 men, who qualify for the Women U23 and Men U23 classes
 respectively, in the Sprint, the Middle distance and the Mass start. No U23 classes are offered
 in the Long distance.
- In the Relay, each federation may enter up to 2 women's teams and 2 men's teams, each consisting of 3 team members.
- Each competitor must have a valid IOF Athlete Licence.

JWMTBOC

- There is one class for women (W20) and one for men (M20). Only competitors who are entitled to compete in these classes may participate.
- All competitors must be citizens of the country of the federation they are representing.
- Competitors participate at their own risk. Third party insurance and personal injury insurance is compulsory and is the responsibility of the competitors' federation or themselves.
- All competitors represent a federation. Each federation may enter a team of an unlimited number of competitors and a number of team officials.
- For all individual competitions, each federation may enter up to 6 women and 6 men.
- In the Relay, each federation may enter up to 2 women's teams and 2 men's teams, each consisting of 3 team members.

Open Categories

There will be three classes in the individual events (middle distance, mass start, long distance): open long, open middle, open short. No relays and no sprint event is going to be held.

Starting groups

For the WMTBOC competitions with an interval start (Sprint, Middle and Long distance), there are four starting groups that remain the same for all races. They are based on the World Ranking list as published on 1/8/2025. Starting group 1 starts first, followed by starting group 2, 3 and at the end starting group 4.

There are three starting groups at the JWMTBOC for the individual competitions.

They are based on the allocation made by the team officials.

A maximum of two competitiors can be allocated to each group. Before allocating a second competitior to a group, one competitor must be alocated to each group.

9. COMPETITION RULES

9.1. Information about rules

All competitions will be organised in accordance with the following rules valid at the time of the event:

- IOF MTBO Competition Rules
- Special Rules MTBO World Cup

All the rules can be found at https://orienteering.sport/mtbo/competition-rules

Further general MTBO rules:

- Competitors must get to all control points with their bikes.
- The bicycle must be with the competitor at all times.
- Wearing a rigid safety helmet is compulsory during competitions and training sessions.
- It is forbidden to use roads or tracks marked with purple crosses or a purple zigzag line on the map.
- Riding outside the mapped area during the competition is not allowed.
- · National traffic rules must be followed.

Non-compliant competitors or competitors who break any rule may be disqualified.

9.2. Deviation from the rules

- Due to the military procedures, organisers had to change the team names deadline from 1st August 2025 to 29th July 2025.
- Symbol 215 (Trench) from ISOM 2017-2 is used on the sprint map
- The start interval at the Long distance will be 2 instead of 3 minutes

9.3. Info about off-track riding

Riding off the track, trail or path is generally allowed, but it is forbidden in cultivated land such as farmlands, forestry cultivation and similar. Off-track riding speed may vary a lot.

9.4. Controls not situated on paths

Control points may be off-track, in rideable open areas. They will be set so as not to require control descriptions.

9.5. Anti-doping

Doping is strictly forbidden and the organisers of WMTBOC/World Cup and JWMTBOC are dedicated to supporting the anti-doping authorities in their work. Doping tests are always carried out in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard for Testing. The IOF Anti-Doping Rules and the World Anti-Doping Code apply. Athletes who are selected for doping tests must bring an official identification (with photo) to the doping test area. The athlete should also bring along their therapeutic use exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, it is advisable that the athletes bring along their ID to all the competitions and events.

10. COMPETITION INFORMATION

10.1. Punching system

SPORTident Air+ (system for contactless punching with SI Active Cards SIAC) with a working range of 150 – 180 cm will be used.

It is recommended that competitors use a backup SIAC/a second SIAC. The data recorded in the backup SIAC will only be used when the main SIAC did not work properly, i.e. in the case of failure of the main SIAC during the race. The backup SIAC cannot be used to rank a competitor if they lost their main card.

To make sure that all controls are recorded by the backup SIAC from the beginning, the backup SIAC must be carried in close proximity to the main SIAC (on the same hand or arm).

In addition to the unit for contactless punching, there will be classical/ non contactless SI unit at each control, which is a backup for failure of the punching unit – but also for failure of the SIAC. Each control will also be equipped with needle punch as a second backup.

10.2. Rental

Competitors may use their own SIAC, but organisers will provide SIACs for rent.

Rental SIACs will be available at € 20 for the whole event – deposit € 80. Team leaders may get those devices in the event office.

10.3. GPS devices

Each competitor in elite categories (WE, ME) will have to take GPS device before the start. Devices will be supplied by organizers. Competitors should take them before entering the first corridor of the starting zone (pre-start; up to 20 minutes). The transmitters will be equipped with armbands. GPS transmitters are to be returned by competitors at the finish line.

11.1. Model event

- Model event map is located near the area where the competition will be held. The map on which the model event will take place was used during this year's Mazovia Cup (long distance).
- The training will be open from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m.
- Maps will be available at the event office.
- The controls are in free order, and there is no timekeeping.
- You will have the opportunity to try out the SPORTident AIR+ system. Bring your SIAC with you!
- Distance from EC (by car) 4,5 km, 9 min
- The car park (located next to the start of the model event) is 4 kilometres from the event office.

Entrance to the relay arena from Szkolna Street (south part of the Hipodrom).



12. COMPLAINTS AND PROTESTS

12.1 Complaints

- A complaint may be made by team officials or competitors about infringements of the rules or the organiser's directions.
- Any complaint must be made in writing on the IOF complaint and protest form, which is available from the event office in the finish arena.
- Complaints must be made as soon as possible and handed in to the event office in the finish arena. The time limit for complaints is 15 minutes after the provisional results have been announced by the speaker. Complaints received after this time limit will only be considered if there are valid exceptional circumstances which must be explained in the complaint.
- There is no fee for a complaint. Complaints can be made by team officials or comepetitors (in writing) and delivered to the event office. The time limit for complaints is 15 minutes after the full results have been published. Complaint must be submitted to the event office in the finish arena.

12.2 Protests

- A protest may be made against the organiser's decision about a complaint. It may only be made by the team official or competitor who made the complaint.
- Any protest must be made in writing on the IOF complaint and protest form, which is available from the event office in the finish arena.
- A protest must be made no later than 15 minutes after the organiser has informed the complainant of the decision about the complaint. Protests received after this time limit may be considered at the discretion of the jury if there are valid exceptional circumstances which must be explained in the protest.
- A protest must be handed in to the event office in the finish arena.
- A protest fee of 50 EUR (or the equivalent in local currency) must be paid when making a protest. It is possible to pay the fee electronically directly to the IOF Office via the IOF website https://orienteering.sport/iof/governance-and-organisation/iof-office/ (by credit card or via a PayPal account). If the protest is accepted by the jury, the fee will be returned.

13. SERVICE

Meals, ordered by teams before the competition, will be delivered to the event center. Team leaders/designated persons may take them from the spot, marked by the organizers (close to the event 's office)

13.2. Bike storage

13.1. Catering

Competitors may leave their bikes in the event arena of the mass start/ long distance; this is the only arena that it is possible. Bike storage is also accessible close to the Event Center (Wheeler company) in Majdan; xccess to the storage must be arranged at the competition office in the EC

13.3. Bike washing

Organizers will provide bike washing in the event arena.

13.4. Bike cometics

On the day of the long distance and relay races (Saturday and Sunday), a stand of the CX80 company (official sponsor of the MTBO World Cup) will be available in the competition centre. At the stand you will be able to try out a variety of bike maintenance and care products.

14. MISCELLANEOUS

14.1. Climate and hazards

Climate

Mazovia experiences quite moderate climate. July and August are the warmest months in Warsaw and surrounding places, but the average temperature is about to 23 °C. Possible rain – but most of the time at least the first half of the day is sunny.

Description of any hazards

- Wild animals like deer, wild boars, moose etc. might be present in the forests of competition areas.
- Wild bees can possibly be encountered in the competition areas.
- Ticks are not that commonly found in the pine forests, which are prevailing around Warsaw, but there are places where they can be encountered. They can spread Lyme disease or borreliosis, and tick-borne encephalitis (TBE). Competitors are asked to protect themselves and to check for ticks after every ride in the forest.

14.3. Media

We welcome all media representatives to cover the competitions of WMTBOC & JWMTBOC and World Cup in Warsaw/ Poland. For media accreditation and related requests, please send an email to: media@wmtboc2025.pl Accreditation should be made by 20th July 2025. Note the information about military areas!

- The media service includes a working area at the Event Centre and the arenas with free Wi-Fi and complimentary coffee or tea, parking close to the arena, and access to some controls in the competition areas.
- Media representatives and team officials are encouraged to bring their own Internet-enabled devices, as neither computers nor Wi-Fi services can be offered by the organisers.
- Weather-protected, quiet working space for media representatives will be provided in all finish arenas.
- Accredited media representatives are given the opportunity to take part in the Model Event.
- If desired, the organisers will assist media representatives with hotel accommodation booking.

14.4. Competition clothing

Competitors must wear the team clothing of their federation during all official events.

14.5. Insurance and liability

Everybody participates in competitions and other activities associated with the WMTBOC &JWMTBOC at their own risk, and each person is responsible for their own insurance coverage (illness/accident and third party insurance).

The organisers decline any liability; they are not responsible for theft or similar incidents either. Participant are encouraged to take necessary precautions.













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
