There are no training possibilities at Budor Ski Arena, except during the Model Events because the area is embargoed. Driving by car on the main road (Budorvegen) through the embargoed area is also forbidden before the long distance Some parts of the embargoed area will be opened for training after the first competitions. Information about this will be given at the team leaders meetings.

There will be possibilities for cross country training at Gåsbu (WC 2014) before and during the ski-o championship. When you are skiing in the Gåsbu area tracks, it is the athletes' own responsibility to avoid skiing to embargoed area.




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Welcome to Løten!

Local food from farms in Løten are well known for their good taste, so if you get to Løten Nærstasjon (railway-station) you can taste and buy some good things made here.


We are pleased to welcome you as our guest in Løten, and hope you will have a nice stay both now and maybe later too!

According to the IOF Competition Rules for Ski Orienteering the competitors participate at their own risk. Insurance against accidents shall be the responsibility of their Federation or themselves, according to national regulations.

We encourage Fair Play:

Rule 26.5 Any attempts to gain information related to the courses, beyond that provided by the organizer, is forbidden before and during the competition

Starting order

In **WSOC**, the 20 best from those entered based on the standing of the World Ranking List are allocated to the red group. Places 1-10 are drawn as the last starting group. Places 11-20 are drawn as the second last starting group. The start times shall be drawn at random within each group. For the rest of the entered athletes the starting order shall be drawn at random within 3 starting groups.

In <u>JWSOC</u> the starting order shall be drawn at random. The draw shall be made in three unrestricted starting groups.

In <u>EYSOC</u> the start draw shall be made with 3 starting groups, each starting group being drawn at random

Equipment:

There will be an equipment depot at the arena all days.

In addition there will be equipment stations in the forest all days.

Equipment can be changed according to rule 21.5.

Mass start: The 1st leg runners will be called to the start area 10 min before start. 3 min before start the runners have to find their starting position. The starting position is marked with numbers. There will be 10 runners in each row. The maps will be handed out 90 sec. before start into the athlete's left hand behind his back. On signal, 15 sec. before start, the athletes are allowed to move the map from behind into their map holder.

Changeover: The changeover takes place by touch. Outgoing team member continues to pick up the map. The maps are placed in holes on a map wall, one wall for leg 2,4 and 6(men) and one wall for leg 3 and 5(women). The maps are marked with the start number. 2nd or 3rd leg map in the top row, 4th or 5th leg map in 2nd row, and 6th leg map in the lowest row. The runners waiting for their next leg, should step out of the changeover zone, and wait in the waiting/warmup zone

emiTags in the sprint relay: 1st leg runners clear their emiTags when they check in for start. 2nd leg runners clear their emiTags when they check in for 1st changeover. **NB!** No reading or clearing of the emiTags after legs 1, 2, 3 and 4! After leg 5 and 6 the competitor proceeds for reading of the emiTag in the finish area.

Equipment : Equipment for the equipment station in the forest have to be delivered at the competition office before 13.30. Team leaders have to place their teams equipment in the equipment depot in the arena before 13.30

Quarantine: To avoid that runners in the later start groups will benefit from contact with athletes that have finished their race, and from the information from the speaker and the arena production, the passage between the east side (start) and the west side(finish) of the road will be closed for competitors from **13.00** till the last start. The restrictions also apply to team leaders. Team leaders can go from start to the finish, but not opposite. .

Start: 300m from the Arena to the start area. The runners will be called to the prestart 4 min before start. 150 m from prestart to start. The runners will be called to the start 2 min before start. The runners can take the map 15 seconds before the start.

Equipment : Equipment for the equipment station in the forest (one station for all classes) have to be delivered at the competition office before 1130 Team leader have to place their teams equipment in the equipment depot in the arena before 11.30

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Start: Warm cabins and toilet at the start.300m from the cabins/parking area to the prestart area. The runners will be called to the prestart 5 min before start. 300 m from prestart to start. The runners will be called to the start 2 min before start. The runners can take the map 15 seconds before the start.

Equipment and refreshment stations:

Equipment and refreshment stations will be centrally located in the terrain. The runners will pass these stations multiple times along the course. 3 refreshment stations, 2 equipment/refreshment stations. The places are marked on the map. Equipment has to be delivered at the competition office before 9.00

Team leader have to place their teams equipment in the equipment depot in the arena before 10.00

Map Change: The map is printed on both sides. At the map change control, the runner have to turn the map, and continue with the second part of the course. Extra maps will be available at the map change control

Mass start: The 1st leg runners will be called to the start area 10 min before start. 3 min before start the runners have to find their starting position. The starting position is marked with numbers. There will be 10 runners in each row. The maps will be handed out 90 sec. before start into the athlete's left hand behind his back. On signal, 15 sec. before start, the athletes are allowed to move the map from behind into their map holder.

Changeover: The changeover takes place by touch. Outgoing team member continues to pick up the map. The maps are placed on the map wall. The maps are marked with the start number. 2^{nd} leg map in the top row. 3^{rd} leg map in 2^{nd} row.

emiTags in the relay: 1st leg runners clear their emiTags when they check in for start. 2nd and 3rd leg runners clear their emiTags when they check in for changeover. After changeover the incoming competitor proceeds for reading of the emiTag in the finish area

Equipment : Equipment for the equipment station in the forest (one station for all classes) have to be delivered at the competition office before 9.00 Team leader have to place their teams equipment in the equipment depot in the arena before 9.00

Punching system

Emit touch free punching system will be used. All competitors will be equipped with emiTags from the organizer. Private emiTags will not be allowed. The runners have to pick up their emiTags personally in the competition office before the model event

GPS tracking:

In the individual races, in M21 and W21 the runners in red group shall carry a GPS tracking unit. In the relay the last leg runners in M21 and W21 will carry GPS Tracking units. The GPS tracking unit will be handed out in the start area. Pockets to carry the GPS-unit on your map holder will be handed out in the competition office.

Wi-Fi:

There will be free Wi-Fi access on the arena

Start number bibs:

Start number bibs shall be clearly visible and worn on both legs. The number bibs may not be folded or cut. The start number bibs will be handed out at the Info Desk before the team leaders meeting

Complains/protest

Complaints and protests shall be made according to the Competition Rules §27 and §28 A complaint must be made in writing to the competition office immediately. A protest must be made in writing to a jury member as fast as possible and within an hour after the organizer has announced its decision.

Rule 28.4 A protest fee of 450 NOK/ 50 EUR shall be paid to the IOF Senior Event Adviser in cash when making the protest. The fee will be returned if the protest is accepted by the jury. If the protest is signed by more than one Federation, each of these Federations will pay the protest fee









Prizes.

After each competition a prize giving ceremony will be held at the arena. Prizes will be awarded according to rule 25

Waxing facilities

There will be possibilities for indoor waxing at accommodation A,B,C and D. Information will be given at the accommodation.

The teams that have ordered waxing cabin or waxing tent at the Competition Center will get information about this at arrival.

Transport

The road to Budor Ski Arena is a private toll road. There is an automatic toll gate. The fee is 50 NOK, and can be paid in cash (coins only) or credit card. No refund. Free parking at the arena.

The teams renting waxing cabin/tent at the Ski Center will get passes for free passage for one car

The teams that have orders transport between accommodation and competition center, have to contact the Event Secretary concerning travel time

Banquet, Closing Party

At Sunday February 15th all athletes and team officials, who have entered to the party before finale entry date, are invited to a party in Hamar Culture House. A light meal will be served and drinks can be bought in the bar. DJ and live music. Tickets for the Closing Party will be handed out in the competition Office.


<u>Anti Doping</u>

Doping is strictly forbidden, and the organizers of the World Ski Orienteering Championships are dedicated to supporting the anti-doping authorities in their work. Doping controls may be carried out any time during the competition period. As some sites for the doping controls may be a few minutes' drive away, we suggest that athletes are prepared at all I events to take along some dry clothes to change into after their race. Doping tests are always carried out in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA

International Standard of testing. The IOF Anti-Doping Rules apply as of 1st January 2015. Athletes who are selected for the doping tests must bring an official identification (with photo) to the doping test area. The athlete should also bring along their therapeutic use exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, it is advisable that the athletes bring along their ID to all the competitions and events.
